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The respond appears to be attached to a round pier, but only the E face of this is visible, the crypt may have originally continued to the N and the rest of the pier may be lost behind later masonry. No base is visible on the W side of the pier. The damaged capital is scalloped and continues to the N respond. There is an arch supported by the E face of the N respond and the W face of the SW respond.

SW corner: In place of a corbel is a plain rectangular block of later date, with a flat inverted "v" hollow on the underside.

NW corner: Similar to N respond but embedded further into W wall, no shaft is visible. damaged capitals and imposts.



VII History

The original church was founded by Roger de Newburgh, Earl of Warwick, in 1123. The crypt, except for the easternmost bay, is all that remains of the original building. The four-centred arches were inserted when Thomas Beauchamp I, Earl of Warwick, died in 1369, while the new choir and choir screen was being built. He was buried in the choir floor immediately above these arches.

VIII Comments/Opinions

The 14thc. octagonal column marks the position of the original E. wall. N. of the W. end is a wing of the same date as the rest of the crypt, which must have extended even further to the N., but was shortened when the vestry above was built. The crypt is constructed in the grey-buff local sandstone. The red sandstone bands in columns 1, 2 and 3 were probably obtained a little further to the N., possibly Kenilworth 5 km. away (author's opinion).

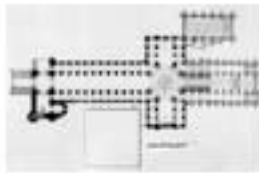

Single order, segmental headed with tympanum and roll corbels. This narrow doorway has plain jambs with roll corbels supporting a tympanum in the same plane. The monolithic tympanum is segmental and carved with an order of plain fictive voussoirs, indicated by inscribed lines, outside. The tympanum is carved with scale ornament. It is supported on a pair of roll corbels, carved on their front faces with fluted sexfoils, and along their sides with single, nested chevrons, alternately roll and hollow.

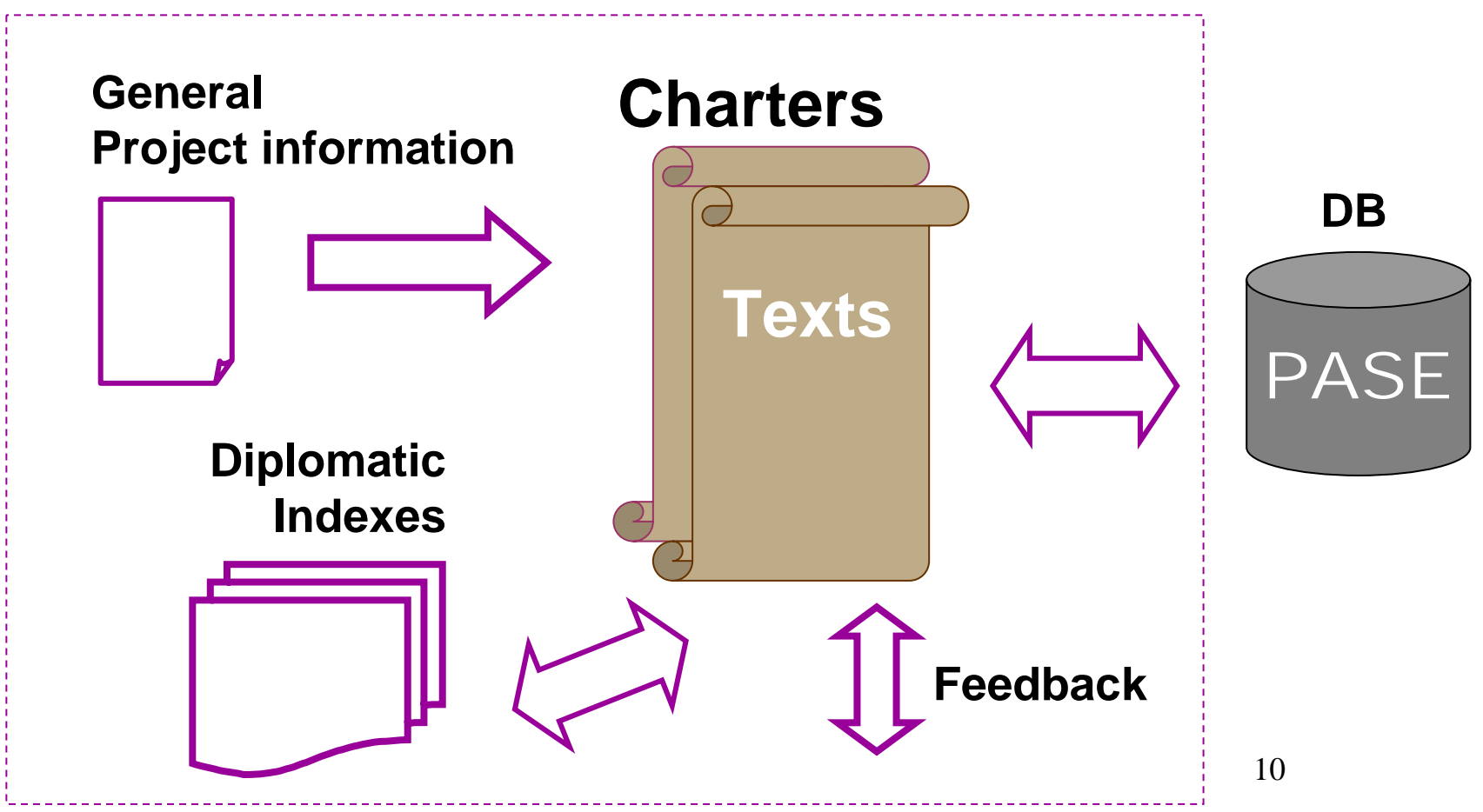


S 165 Cenwulf, king of Mercia (811): BL Cotton Charter viii. 3, from Rochester

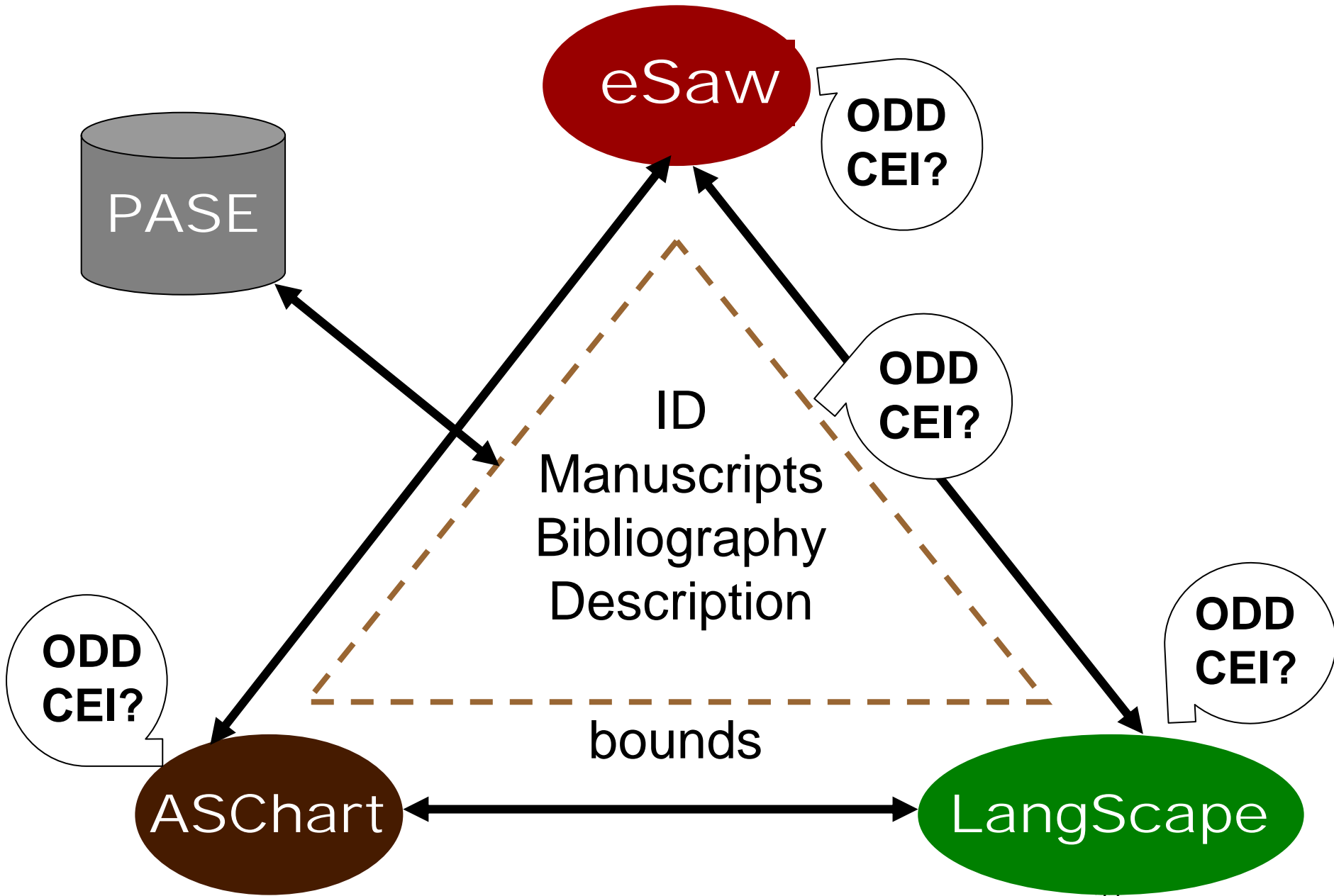
